2. Conference - How business can tackle modern slavery and forced labour – 5 May - London, UK

This one-day conference will provide businesses with practical, authoritative guidance from leading organisations

on how best to address modern slavery/forced labour risks in their operations and supply chain. With over 30 speakers and 100 delegates from the likes of Walmart Stores, HP, the Coca Cola Company, Thai Union, IKEA to name several. This will be one of the leading global forums on how companies can effectively tackle slavery on both a strategic and operational level.

The conference will also have dedicated tracks for the agriculture, construction, manufacturing and fisheries sectors to discuss in depth, contextual solutions.

We are also supporting a **workshop on 6th May on modern slavery due diligence and reporting** in London. The workshop will provide participants with detailed exposure to approaches and techniques for businesses to carry out due diligence on human rights and modern slavery issues, including collaborative approaches; sources of information and designing and implementing action plans. Through interactive exercises, it will also develop participants' understanding of the requirements of the UK Modern Slavery Act and provide them with the knowledge and tools to prepare a good practice statement under the Act. It will also include a presentation of Ergon Associates' analysis of 250 Modern Slavery statements, prior to publication.
