Over the past 25 years, the United States has seen a disturbing militarization of its sworn law enforcement offices – a 25% increase in SWAT team raids, a mass influx of military-grade equipment in small-town communities, and the seeming immunity of a new force of violent warrior-cops.

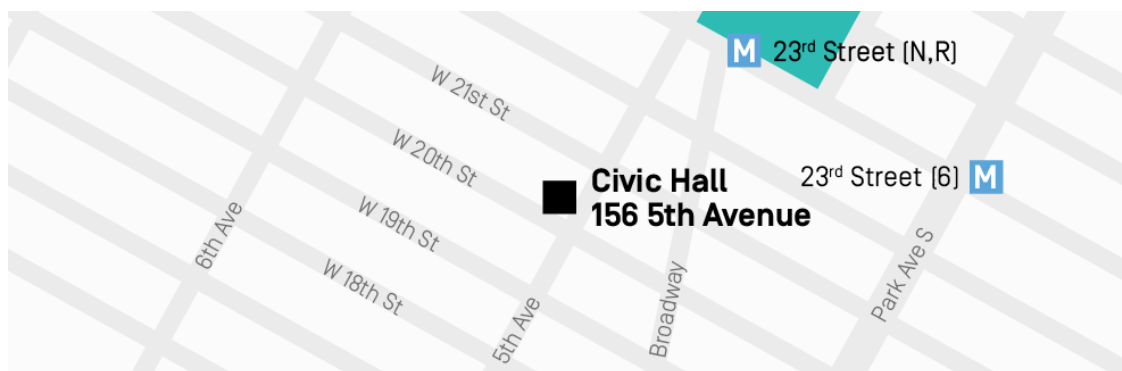
