We have big plans for the months ahead to finally get bee-killing neonics off the shelves. We will keep up the pressure on big hardware chains to stop selling the pesticide, and want to expand our fight to make sure grocery stores stop selling neonics, too.

Right now, we are throwing everything we've got at **stopping the merger between Monsanto and Bayer**. Can you imagine those two companies under one roof? It would be a catastrophe for the bees, farmers, and our whole planet.
